Key achievements to date until July 2022:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As a result of improved teaching, the % of pupils attaining ARE improved in 2021-2022 in Year 2 (79%) and Year 6 (85%). 100% of pupils took part in the daily mile. 100% of pupils received coaching during lunchtimes from Active Fusion and Activ8. 100% of pupils took part in additional 30 minutes of daily physical activity. When reviewing support provided Y2 teachers reported improved confidence from July 2022. We have retained our Active Travel Silver Award and School Games Gold Award. The impact of COVID on the proportion of Year 4,5 and 6 pupils meeting the end of key stage 2 swimming standards was minimised as a result of our long term strategy to provide National Curriculum tuition earlier in the key stage with top up lessons where required. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers require exemplification and delivery support with gymnastics, through team teaching with coaches. Fewer pupils took part in a narrower range of competitions in the Autumn term due to the impact of COVID. Teacher confidence to challenge pupils within a lesson when needed and to ensure they are confidently delivering the planning.
