## Review of last year's spend and key achievements

Entered a range of competitions and sporting events, through Trust and coaching networks.	Children have participated in a range of sporting competitions and have placed in the top 3 more frequently this year, including 2 x 1 <sup>st</sup> places. Children with SEND and PP children have attended Festival of Sports with Active Fusion that enabled them to participate in a range of activities they won't have played before, developing their confidence in sport. Many PP and SEND children from all year groups have attended After School Clubs this year. Sandringham have participated in many girls' competitions this year, particularly in KS2. The number of girls signing up for After-School Clubs was also high. KS2 achieved 3 <sup>rd</sup> place in the Trust Games event. No children were unable to take part in competitions due to cost. These children are on a rota and work with other children during their breaktime to provide peer-led activities. These children have developed in confidence and the children have enjoyed playing a range of different activities that the playground leaders have offered.	School staff are trained to deliver this to pupils, improving the sustainability of the strategy. This is scheduled to take place in the autumn term.
Staff are more confident to provide to teach the PE curriculum due to training and support from PE coaches.	Staff have improved confidence in teaching of individual areas of weakness through the use of the coaches and therefore are more knowledgeable on how to teach high quality lessons.	We intend to continue this strategy next year and 5 x teachers are new to school.
Year 5 children attended catch-up swimming provision to secure expected standards where this was not met in year 4.	82% of pupils met the 25m and efficient stroke standards. 98% met the self-rescue standard.
