Uniform

We allow pupils to wear a range of options linked to our school colours and traditional uniform:

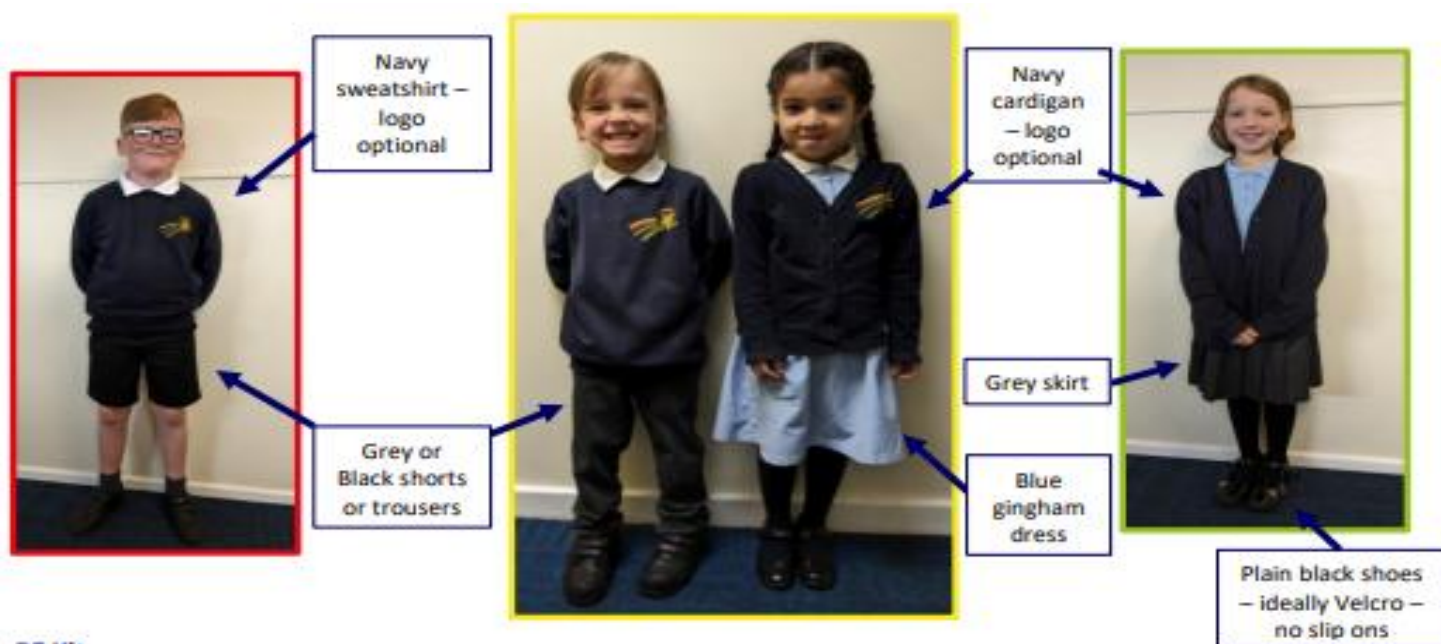
- navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan (school logo optional)
- white polo shirt (school logo optional) or white blouse/shirt with navy tie (optional)
- navy/grey/black skirt or trousers
- grey/black school shorts
- grey pinafore or blue gingham dress
- black sensible school shoes/school trainers (no high heels, slip-ons or sandals, preferably Velcro-fastening for younger pupils)
- navy, white or black hair accessories.
- cold weather: warm coat, hat and gloves
- warmer weather: waterproof jacket and navy, black or white sunhat without logos.

We do not require pupils to wear any items with logos, although these are an option for families who would like this.

We encourage families to adapt uniform to consider their cultural backgrounds or religion.

The school also has specific rules regarding hair styles and the wearing of make-up, nail varnish and nail extensions. This is because we want pupils to focus on their learning. Pupils are not permitted to wear hoodies within school.

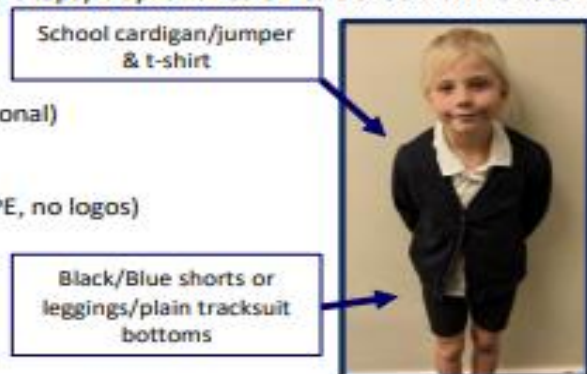


PE Kit

A message from Mrs Stringfellow...

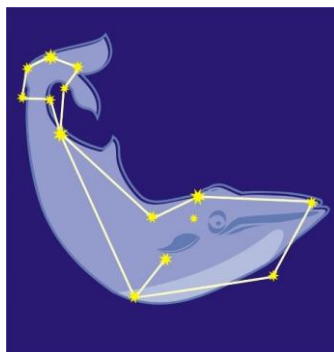
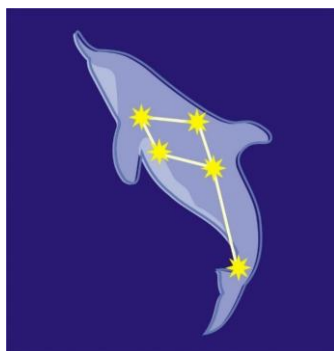
Nursery have enjoyed learning about different celebrations. They enjoyed taking part in their first remembrance service with school and rehearsing for their first Christmas concert.

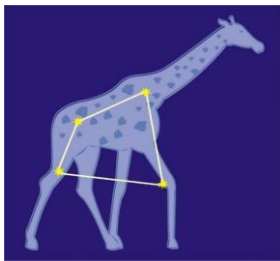
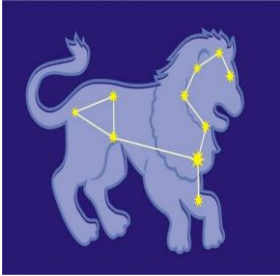

Year 1 – Lions & Giraffes



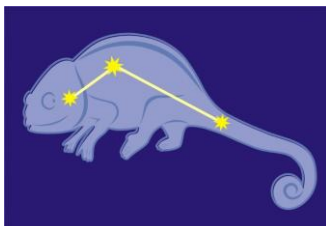
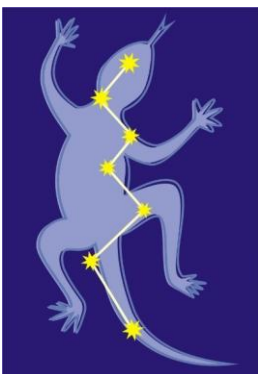
A message from Mrs Smithard, Mrs Waterland & Mrs Shepherd...

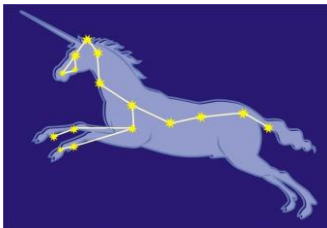
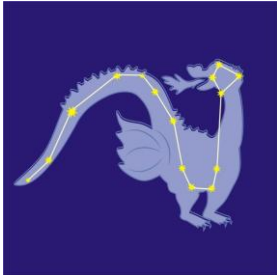
We have thoroughly enjoyed preparing our Christmas performance of The Sleepy Shepherd. It has been fabulous and full of festive cheer!

A message from Mr Campbell & Miss Mawson....

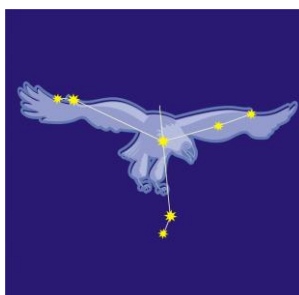
We have had a wonderful half term in Year 5, where the children have been fully immersed in their learning. Our new text, Room 13, has already inspired some brilliantly powerful descriptive writing, with the class producing vivid and atmospheric pieces based on Dracula. Their enthusiasm and creativity have been fantastic to see.

A highlight for many was our exciting trip to Whitby. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring the famous landmarks linked to our text and taking part in a fossil hunt on the beach. Their behaviour throughout the few days there was exemplary; they were a real credit to the school, showing curiosity, respect, and a positive attitude from start to finish.

Since returning, we have been building on our geography skills by looking closely at ordnance survey maps of Whitby. The children have enjoyed comparing the coastal landscape to Doncaster and discussing the similarities and differences between the two areas.

Looking ahead, we are excited to begin our new science topic on space next half term. The children are already eager to find out more about planets, stars, and the wider universe. A reminder that PE days will continue to be on Mondays and Thursdays.

Year 6 – Doves & Eagles



A message from Mr McCurdy & Mrs Sutton...

Year 6 have had a purposeful and productive half term, showing fantastic maturity as they move further into their final year at Sandringham. In English, pupils have been developing their extended writing through high-quality texts, focusing on tone, structure and viewpoint. Their survival narratives, dual narratives and reports have shown real ambition and progress. In Maths, pupils have strengthened their reasoning and problem-solving, particularly in fractions, percentages and multi-step calculations, and are becoming increasingly confident when explaining their methods during discussion.

A standout highlight of the term was our Social Justice Project, which allowed Year 6 to truly shine. Working with a professional dance school, pupils created a powerful performance blending dance, music, art and spoken word—all themed around Hope, Identity and Unity. Their teamwork, creativity and determination were exceptional, and the final piece was so impressive that it became the talk of the entire Trust. Senior leaders praised the ambition, professionalism and emotional impact of the performance, recognising just how much work the children poured into producing something so meaningful. It was a perfect example of Year 6 “going out with a bang” and showcasing both their competitiveness and their ability to deliver a polished, moving performance.

This half term, we also began sharing assessment information with pupils and families to help everyone understand where children are currently working and what their next steps are. Alongside this, our morning booster sessions have continued to grow in strength. These sessions—designed to give targeted support in maths, which we hope to extend to reading, and test technique—are a brilliant opportunity for pupils to revisit learning, fill gaps and build confidence. We are encouraging pupils (and parents) to take increasing responsibility for their learning journey while we continue to provide the very best opportunities for success. As always, we are throwing everything at them (including the kitchen sink!) to help them achieve their potential.

Year 6 have also represented the school superbly in music events, community opportunities and assemblies, consistently demonstrating leadership and responsibility.

Looking ahead to next half term, pupils will continue preparing for SATs with a focus on retrieval strategies, inference, arithmetic fluency and crafting high-quality writing. We will also begin our new curriculum topics and continue building their confidence, resilience and readiness for secondary school. PE days continue to be Monday and Fridays.
