New school dinner system

Uniform Reminder

We allow pupils to wear a range of options linked to our school colours and traditional uniform:

- navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan (school logo optional)
- white polo shirt (school logo optional) or white blouse/shirt with navy tie (optional)
- navy/grey/black skirt or trousers
- grey/black school shorts
- grey pinafore or blue gingham dress
- black sensible school shoes/school trainers (no high heels, slip-ons or sandals, preferably Velcro-fastening for younger pupils)
- navy, white or black hair accessories.
- <u>cold weather:</u> warm coat, hat and gloves
- warmer weather: waterproof jacket and navy, black or white sunhat without logos.
- We do not require pupils to wear any items with logos, although these are an option for families who would like this.
- We encourage families to adapt uniform to take into account their cultural backgrounds or religion.

The school also specific rules regarding hair styles and the wearing of make-up, nail varnish and nail extensions. This is because we want pupils to focus on their learning. We do not want to encourage an environment where children are competing in terms of their appearance or how "fashionable" they look.




PE Kit

Nursery

Nursery have had a great half term learning all about 'People Who Help us'. They've had visits from many people to learn about their jobs including: the police, a train driver, a radiographer and some of the different staff in school.

Reception

Reception children have enjoyed learning about our local area, our country and some other countries around the world! They have been learning about hot and cold climates, have enjoyed using globes and maps, and have been spotting the features of our local area.

Year 1
In English, Year 1 have been learning how to write a letter to describe our toy. They have enjoyed sharing many stories, their favourite story was 'Arlo.' In Maths they have been learning about numbers to 20, using addition to solve problems. They have enjoyed learning about our King and different members of the royal family in history.
Year 2
Year 2 have enjoyed learning about Africa through our class novel Anna Hibiscus and also by researching African animals in order to create information texts. In computing they have been working on algorithms by programming sequences for floor robots. In science they have studied different materials and their uses. What materials can you spot around your home?
Year 3
Y3 have started reading their new book 'The Wild Robot' by Peter Brown and have used this as inspiration for narrative writing, thinking about what Roz could see and hear. They have been learning about the countries and counties of the United Kingdom and their human and physical features.
Year 4
Year 4 have been writing a Newspaper Report based on their class text. They have continued to work on multiplication & division, learning about related facts and factors and products. In Science, they've looked at teeth and how they help in the digestive system. Their Geography focus has been lines of longitude and latitude and how they help us find places around the world. They've started with the recorder in Music, learning how to read music and playing new notes.

Year 5

As part of their Earth and Space topic, Year 5 have been reading the book "Cosmic" by Frank Cottrill Boyce alongside using Apollo 13 as their stimulus for writing. The children have been exploring forces and the impact of Gallio in science and biomes in Geography. As part of their DT food and nutrient topic, Toucans had a wonderful visit to pizza express.

Year 6

Year 6 have had another positive half term! They have very much enjoyed starting their new class novel Fireweed, a story of two evacuees during the Second World War. They have just started their ratio unit in maths and the children are nailing it! They have also been practicing their arithmetic skills and the teachers have been very impressed with the progress that the children are making. Let's keep this up!

Nursery

Nursery's next topic is 'In the Garden'. The children will be looking at growing things from seeds and bulbs and looking at different plants and trees in the garden. **Reminders:** Please keep working on teaching your child to do their own zip in the cold weather. As it also starts to get warmer we will be back to Muddy Monday's so please ensure your child has their wellies in school.

Reception

Reception are so excited to learn all about our oceans and their inhabitants in our next topic. They are looking forward to their key text, 'Rainbow Fish'. Their trip to 'The Deep' is going to really bring their learning to life! What amazing creatures they will see? **Reminder:** Please ensure your child brings their book bag to school every day and also to bring their wellies or outside shoes for Forest Fridays. **Don't forget to log your child's reading on LearningWithParents.**

Year 1

Year 1 will be learning about materials in science and continents, oceans, UK countries, capital cities and surrounding seas in Geography. They will be reading many more stories including 'Where the Wild Things Are,' and learning how to write a fantasy story. **Reminder:** Please ensure your child brings their book bag to school every day. Pupils should be reading at home 5 times per week and completing 20 minutes of Times Table Rockstars each night. **Don't forget to log your child's reading on LearningWithParents.**

Year 2

Year 2's new novel will be, Bill's New Frock. Their topic in history will be about 'The Great Fire of London'. In maths they will continue with multiplication and division so please keep practising on Times Tables Rock Stars!

Reminder: Please ensure your child brings their book bag to school every day. Pupils should be reading at home 5 times per week and completing 20 minutes of Times Table Rockstars each night. **Don't forget to log your child's reading on LearningWithParents.**

Year 3

Year 3 will be learning about the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. They shall be visiting Danum Museum to help bring our learning to life.

Reminder: Pupils should be reading at home 5 times per week and completing 20 minutes of Times Table Rockstars each night. **Don't forget to log your child's reading on LearningWithParents.**

Year 4

Year 4 will be following Edward Tulane on his miraculous adventure in their English and shared reading lessons to inspire their own pieces of creative writing. They will also be learning about the Viking Invasion of Anglo-Saxon Britain as well as the Norman Invasion in 1066. They're super excited for their trip to York to explore Jorvik's DIG experience to learn more about the Vikings and their famous battle strategies. **Reminder:** Pupils should be reading at home 5 times per week and completing 20 minutes of Times Table Rockstars each night. TT Rockstars is a great way to practice for the upcoming Multiplications Checks in June! **Don't forget to log your child's reading on LearningWithParents.**

Year 5

Year 5 are looking forward to finding out how the book ends, as well as moving onto their History topic where they will study Myan's. They have also booked the Wonderdome to come into school, so please remember to make payment on parent pay. **Reminder:** Pupils should be reading at home 5 times per week and completing 20 minutes of Times Table Rockstars each night. **Don't forget to log your child's reading on** <u>LearningWithParents</u>.

Year 6

As Year 6 move onto their history unit, they will be looking at some of the causes of the war and the different countries that were involved. They're even going to write a newspaper report detailing the outbreak of the war. **Reminder:** SATs booster sessions will start after school on Tuesday 20th February – make sure you have signed up to these. It will be great for revision. Don't forget TT Rockstars, 20 minutes each night to really help improve in maths. Read 5 times per week. All practice will help with SATs. **Don't forget to log your child's reading on LearningWithParents.**

Pupils from Years 5 and 6 enjoyed a wonderful afternoon of Athletics this half-term, competing against other Doncaster schools and gained 5th place overall. We are so proud of all the pupils for giving 100 percent.
