As we conclude an incredible academic year at Sandringham Primary, I am filled with pride reflecting on our collective achievements. It has been a year defined by hard work, resilience, and exceptional success.

Our pupils have shown fantastic academic commitment, outperforming national averages. I am particularly pleased to share these highlights:

- EYFS: 76% achieved a Good Level of Development.
- Phonics: 83% passed the Phonics Screening Check.
- Year 4: 73% achieved full marks (25/25) in the Multiplication Tables Check.
- Year 6: 82% met the expected standard in writing.

Our sporting year was equally spectacular. While we had some logistical challenges due to the recent hot weather, I was delighted that we were finally able to share our annual Sports Day with you. It was a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our pupils' spirit and sportsmanship, capping off a year that also saw us secure the School Games Platinum award.

We are incredibly proud of everything you have achieved; keep reaching for stars and carrying the values you have developed with you.

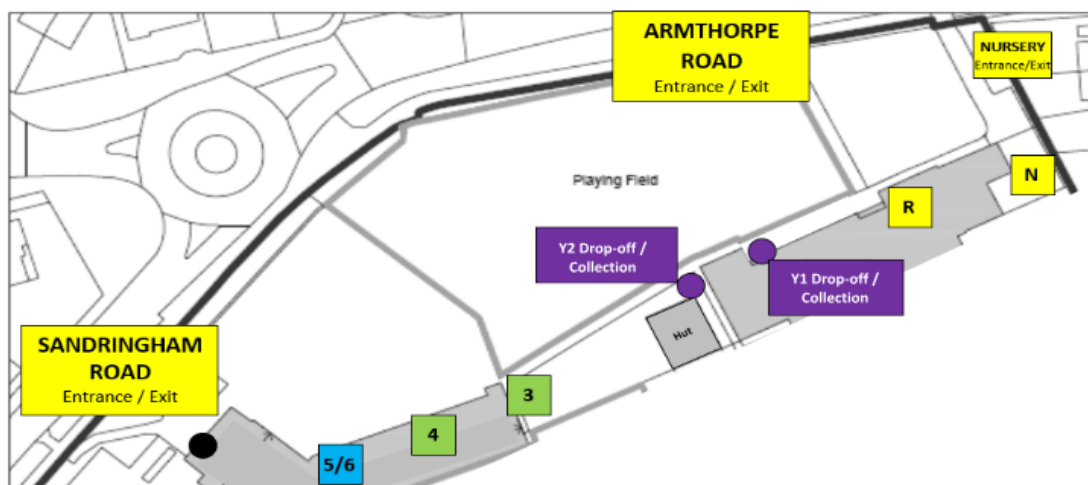

This prestigious recognition is a testament to our school's outstanding, long-term commitment to PE, sport, and physical activity, and we are incredibly proud to have achieved this status once again.

Uniform

We allow pupils to wear a range of options linked to our school colours and traditional uniform:

- navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan or ¼ zip top (school logo optional)
- white or navy polo shirt (school logo optional) or white blouse/shirt with navy tie (optional)
- navy/grey/black skirt or trousers
- grey/black school shorts
- grey pinafore or blue gingham dress
- black sensible school shoes/school trainers (no high heels, slip-ons or sandals, preferably Velcro-fastening for younger pupils)
- navy, white or black hair accessories.
- cold weather: warm coat, hat and gloves
- warmer weather: waterproof jacket and navy, black or white sunhat without logos.

We do not require pupils to wear any items with logos, although these are an option for families who would like this.

We encourage families to adapt uniform to consider their cultural backgrounds or religion.

The school also has specific rules regarding hair styles and the wearing of make-up, nail varnish and nail extensions. This is because we want pupils to focus on their learning. We do not want to encourage an environment where children are competing in terms of their appearance or how “fashionable” they look.

Pupils are not permitted to wear hoodies within school.

PE Kit

Pupils should wear their usual school jumper on PE days (not tracksuit tops). Pupils in Years 1 to 6 should arrive at school dressed in their PE bottoms and will wear these all day. Our school PE kit includes:

- usual navy-blue sweatshirt (for outdoor PE, school logo optional)
- usual white polo shirt (school logo optional)
- navy blue/black sports shorts (no logos)
- navy blue/black leggings or tracksuit bottoms (for outdoor PE, no logos)
- plain trainers

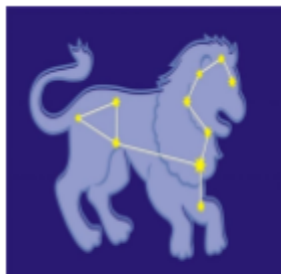

Year 2 have had a busy and exciting term, packed with fantastic learning and new experiences! In English, we have loved reading *Izzy the Inventor* and *the Unexpected Unicorn*. Inspired by Izzy's adventures, we became scientists ourselves and wrote our own explanation texts on how to make slime—an activity that was a huge hit with everyone! We also explored the magical world of fairy tales and enjoyed meeting a range of wonderful characters. To finish the term, we discovered the brilliant stories of famous children's author Roald Dahl through our class novel, *George's Marvellous Medicine*. In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of fractions of amounts, as well as mass and capacity. We have also worked hard to become times tables experts, building confidence with our 2, 5 and 10 times tables and the related division facts. It has been wonderful to see how much progress everyone has made throughout the year.

In Science, we have been investigating plants and discovering what they need to grow and stay healthy. We explored how seeds germinate and bulbs sprout, and carried out our own investigation by planting bulbs in different positions to find out whether they could grow sideways or even upside down! Our History lessons took us on a journey back in time to learn about the Great Fire of London. We explored what life was like in 1666, discovered how the fire started and spread so quickly, and investigated the lasting impact it had on the city of London. In Geography, we compared the United Kingdom and Kenya, learning about their physical and human features, as well as their cultures and traditions. We also enjoyed exploring traditional African and Aboriginal art, creating our own colourful pieces inspired by these artistic styles.

Year 2 have shown enthusiasm, curiosity and determination in everything they have done this term. We are incredibly proud of all they have achieved and look forward to even more exciting learning adventures ahead!

A message from Mrs Speck & Mrs Hales-Beck...

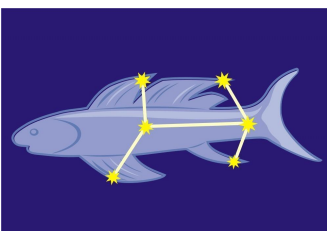
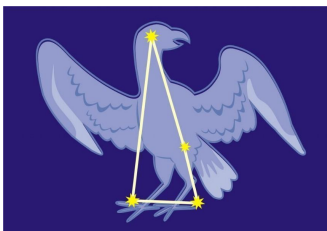

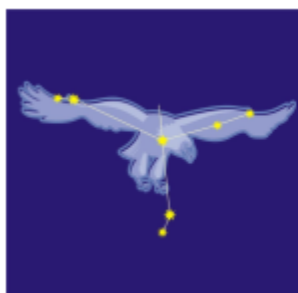
